Parking

Please can all students be reminded that there is <u>no student parking on school site</u>. Tesco do allow students to park at the back of their car park (close to the recycling area) and we recommend that Sixth formers utilise this.

Students are not permitted to park at Screwfix / Pure Gym, or on any of the staff car parks. There are parking restrictions on Back Lane so we strongly advise against parking there.

Signing in & out:

Please can all students and parents/carers be reminded that all Sixth Form students must attend registration and remain in school for all lessons and free periods.

Students are provided with a gate card to allow them leave site during break and lunch. When leaving/returning, they must sign out/back in at the office or with the QR code on the gate.

If a student misses form time, they must sign in with the office or via the QR code. If a student is unwell or has a medical appointment, please let us know via sixthform@tahs.org.uk or 01889 561820.

Sixth Form Finance:

The school has been allocated a Discretional Bursary Fund (DBF) which students are able bid into throughout the academic year providing they meet the financial criteria set by the school and outlined in our DBF policy.

For the academic year 2023-2024 students are eligible for funding of up to £400 if their parental income is below £27,000 (proof required) or if they were designated as pupil premium. If a student is a looked after child (LAC) they may be entitled to up to £1,200 of financial support. Students must use this funding to support their Post-16 education. For example, Sixth Form uniform, transport costs to and from school, textbooks, revision guides, course materials, IT equipment (up to £150), educational visits, UCAS application Fee, University entrance tests etc.
